Shelly Logan, Town Treasurer– Financial Reports

Shelly gave the monthly budget report. Currently there are no budget concerns.

Mayor Brad Hawkes: Community Plan for Sustainable Growth

It was decided to wait and see what the Planning Commission does. Planning Commission Member Chris Hawkes who authored this document was not present at the planning commission meeting to review this document.

Mayor Brad Hawkes: Emergency Preparedness Coordinator

Mayor Hawkes reported that he has visited with Claine Burt about being our emergency preparedness coordinator. Claine accepted. Claine will get with the Box Elder County emergency preparedness manager and get things up to date.

Council Member Craig Hawkes: Increasing Town Wages

Council Member Hawkes discussed increasing wages. Our town clerk will be leaving in April and at \$16.00 per hour we will not get anyone to apply for the position.

Mayor Brad Hawkes stated the road fund and water fund have sufficient funds for a pay increase. He is concerned about administrative and post office. He asked Clerk H. Leon Kotter to gather information on four areas: Roads, Water, Administration and Post Office and present it in March's town council meeting.

Key for Community Center when rented

It has been hard to get a key to those who rent the Community Center. A key lock box has been installed next to the bulletin board by the main door. The key will be placed in the box. A code will be given to the renter. Enter the code, open box, remove key. When finished put key back in the box and close the door.

Mayor, Council Member Reports

Mayor Brad Hawkes:

- In April, the power will be off here in the community center for two days while Rocky Mountain Power and Geary Electric are doing electrical work to change out meters.
- Due to unexpected changes in our application for a Community Development Block Grant, we cancelled our application. The estimated cost of our road project was over four hundred thousand dollars. The CDBG has a cap of two hundred thousand dollars.

Council Member Rex Nessen: Not Present

Council Member Josh Anderson:

- The memorial cabinet for Sgt. Rocky D. Payne who was killed in military action cannot be mounted on a wall. It must be set on a cabinet. He is looking for a cabinet.
- The shelving in the area where the town council meets needs repairs. The shelving top new needs new Formica. The shelving face will be cover will dry wall and painted.

Council Member Craig Hawkes:

- We are waiting for engineering so that we can finish the shed that will house the chlorine tanks for our water system.
